SUMMARY OF DUTIES:

Over the next three years, TCOMM911 will replace the public safety land mobile radio system to a digital, P25 trunked system, a \$30 million-dollar project. The Lead Radio Systems Technician will provide an advanced level of support, maintenance, and repairs of emergency and non-emergency voice and data radio and microwave systems, including infrastructure, equipment, interfaces and facilities. Other responsibilities include installing, programming and maintaining communications consoles, recording equipment and electronic devices, and performing advanced technical work on land mobile radio systems and other equipment, including the 700 MHz and VHF public safety radio system, digital microwave network, dispatch consoles, and supporting computer systems and networks. This position will also assist the Radio Systems Manager with coordinating workload demands and the work flow of the department.
